



In 7x11 casserole, layer 1-1/2 cups tom. Sauce, 3 las. Noodles, 1/3 egg mixture &3/4 cup Mozzarello cheese. Repeat two more times (Reserve a little tom. Sauce to top last layer of noodles.) Top w/parm.cheese. Cover w/double layer of plastic wrap. Micro High 8 min, Then on 50% Power 30 min. or until noodles are tender. Let stand 10-15 min.









